NORCEMOG AT LOWTHER CASTLE AND GARDENS 8 March 2015

After a Saturday of expectation, polishing and double checking that all was in order on 'Stanley' the series II for what would be its first serious outing of the season. Incantations had been chanted to the moon for a dry warm day, as Stanley has still to gain any weather equipment or a heater.

Sunday dawned with stair rods from the sky and hopes dashed (for me anyway, Sue was delighted) We set off in the Mondeo for the trip to Lowther Castle and its Gardens. We left in good time (Roy it's about an hour and a half) and the sky cleared as we passed Lancaster and we arrived at 11.00am to a crisp March morning and found 6 cars had braved the trip to the Lake District. Now where to look for the other Morgan types who had also ignored the cold head for the cafe! Success 18 friends were to be found thawing. Coffee and half a scone later, suitably fortified and under the stewardship of our very knowledgeable guide we spent the next few hours touring the remains of the castle and gardens, it must have been one of the area's finest houses - but unusually not terribly old.

The work to recover the castle ruins and gardens from 70 years of neglect has been extensive. The charity has made safe 80% of the ruined castle (it still needs a dab of plaster or two!!) and the team have unearthed many areas thought to have been lost, including a Japanese garden and an enormous rock garden (its a sort of Heligan of the North). The weather although cold stayed dry and sunny but after 2 hours walking the garden the cafe beckoned for a 2nd thawing and lunch. After lunch the obligatory trip to the fishing tackle shop in Penrith and then home.

If you didn't make the visit I would recommend it highly if you go soon the daffodils will be in full bloom. Thank up Adrian for a great day.

7 Proposal to increase Northern Centre Subscription to £10 from 2016

Although we are currently well funded the committee felt that expenditure should be considered and provisions made looking at requirements over the next 3-5 years. Items and anticipated costs include

- Replacement of existing outdated NorceMog banner with stand-alone 'Feather' banners. Cost £100 - £200
- Purchase of a 'professional quality' gazebo for use at NorceMog events and displays e.g. Arley Hall, Tatton Park, Gawsworth Hall, Autotest, Gymkhana etc. Cost £500 - £600
- Subsidy of Christmas Party to provide decorations and novelties etc. Cost £200 max
- Replenishment of unique NorceMog merchandise (e.g. Car Badges) Cost £800
- Miscellaneous Expenses e.g. Web site domain and web hosting, Trophies & engraving, Gratuities, event deposits (e.g. Christmas Party) approx. £350 p.a.

In addition, 2018 will be the 50th Anniversary of The Northern Centre – NorceMog. Naturally we will want to celebrate the year and possibly commission celebratory regalia. The proposed increase in subscription is to finance the above and provide funds for the Golden Celebration Year.

A members vote will be taken on this proposal at the meeting.
