

The Inn at Whitewell Meeting: 12th January

The NorceMog season opener was the traditional annual lunch at the Inn at Whitewell in the Forest of Bowland, Lancashire.

The Inn itself is a former coaching Inn dating from the 16th century used for travelers to rest on their journeys to and from





Being January, the previous week had seen quite a lot of snow across much of the county, and there was still a lot laying on the ground in the fields and on the houses, making it very picturesque.

Fortunately though the roads were passable with a bit of care, although no one ventured to the Inn in their Morgan!

About 30 NorceMoggers (if that's the collective noun) arrived around noon for a chat before ordering their Sunday lunches at the bar. You could hear that the conversations where enquiring of "how was your Christmas and New Year?", "have you been out in the Morgan?" and "what holiday plans have you made for 2025?" etc etc.....

Although we all ordered separately via the bar, it seemed that as a group we were largely

eating at the same time. The staff did a great job of trying to ensure that the 5 or so tables all received their tables food at pretty much the same time.

The menu was very exciting, with Venison, Partridge and homemade Fish Pie competing with the more traditional Lamb and Roast Beef dishes. I assume the vegetarian / vegan options were as equally exciting?





2½ hours later, after much chatting and consuming fine food, we started to leave, but not after exploring the shop of fine wines from around the world and local produce that the Inn sells.

The Inn also has a number of bedrooms, and a one or two night stay to explore the Inn and the

surrounding Forest of Bowland which is an AONB is well worth doing.

The final point was made by a few members, which was the recommendation of visiting the Inn again, but this time in summer!

Stoke Lacy

On one of our many visits to the Morgan factory, David Roberts and myself stop on the way back at the village of Stoke Lacy.

Stoke Lacey is a village with a unique connection, via the local church, to the Morgan family, it lies roughly fourteen miles West of Malvern towards Hereford.

If you visit the church, <u>St. Peter & St. Paul</u>, you will find several plaques describing the Morgan family connection to the village and a number of stained glass windows dedicated to the Morgan family.

So, with permission and acknowledgement to Stoke Lacy church, I reproduce here from the plaques in Stoke Lacy church extracts of the Morgan story and Stoke Lacy:

"The church of St. Peter & St. Paul in Stoke Lacy is integral to the story of the Morgan family. Henry Fredrick Stanley (HFS also known as 'Harry') Morgan's grandfather, Henry Morgan became the village Rector in 1871. He was greatly loved and respected in the village for being a very caring man who went the extra mile for his parishioners quite literally, in fact, when looking after the sick and infirm.

Reverend Henry died in 1886 and was succeeded by his son Henry George who became the life and soul of Stoke Lacy holding the post of Rector for 50 years.

George and Florence married in 1875 celebrating in the village. Harry (HFS) was born six years later in the 11th August 1881 at the "New House" in Moreton Jeffries. George had already followed his father into a career in the church as Curate at Stoke Lacy and in 1886 George moved his family to Stoke Lacy on becoming the Rector.

George Morgan was a man who seemed to hold the whole community together and somehow everything revolved around him. Social events of every kind, as diverse as fetes, theatrical events and the village children's Christmas parties, were organised and often paid for by the Rector, many being held in the Rectory grounds.

Harry's family remained living in Stoke Lacy while he developed his design and engineering skills ultimately establishing his motor car company in 1905 with his first garage. Working in Malvern and using suppliers in nearby Bromyard, Harry and his sister Dot were often seen driving their various prototype cars at some fearful speed through the village. Local newspapers provide evidence of not one but many road offences such as travelling without a light or at excessive speeds of 20 miles per hour! When he wasn't ministering to the Parish or enjoying his hobbies, George was trying to placate the local constabulary with regards to yet more of Harry's driving misdemeanours.

1912 proved to be momentous year for the young Harry. At the age of 31 he established the Morgan Motor Company with his father the Rev. George as Chairman. Harry and George were the only two shareholders. The company was to major solely on the "Runabout".

Later that year Harry married Hilda Ruth Day on the 12th June 1912. Ruth was also the daughter of clergy, her father being Rev. Archibald Day, Vicar of St. Matthias Church Malvern. She was a lively and extroverted lady who proved a good match for the introverted Harry. A year later the couple had their first child Sylvia, soon to be followed by Stella, Brenda, Eileen and, eventually, Peter Morgan who became a much loved friend of the current day Stoke Lacy residents.

Harry's only son, Peter Morgan, became the Managing Director of the Morgan Motor Company in 1957. Like his grandfather and great-grandfather before him, he became a great friend to the village. Peter's own children Charles and Jill are now Patrons of the church."





Peter Morgan was a loyal patron of this church. His father H.F.S. Morgan founded the Morgan Motor Company. His grandfather and great grandfather were Rectors of this church from 1871-1937. Peter Morgan enjoyed a special relationship with Morgan enthusiasts. In appreciation, a group of Morgan enthusiasts and clubs around the world contributed to this window in his memory.


Stained glass windows in the porch of Stoke Lacy Church and a dedication plate also in the porch.

Morgan enthusiast should visit, with their Morgan, the church of St. Peter and St. Paul at Stoke Lacey; in an automotive and non-ecclesiastical way, it's rather like travelling to Rome or Mecca!

Note from David Roberts: 'Incidentally, the design of flowing front wings and cowl, that replaced the early Flat Rad Plus 4's bluff frontal appearance, were directly influenced by Peter Morgan. Furthermore, the 4/4 Series II of 1956 with its lower body line gave its lines to the Plus 4 that won the 2 litre class of the 1962 Le Mans 25 Hour race and went on to create the Plus 4 Super Sports model. More importantly, Peter Morgan's 4/4 Series II low line body continued virtually unchanged, on all 4/4 models from 1956 and, in widened and lengthened form, the Plus 8 and Plus 4 up to 2019 and the end of production of the traditional steel chassised cars.'

The Morgan Runabout

Morgan 'Runabout'

The Morgan factory has an Archive Room containing several historic Morgans one of which is a reconstruction of the first Morgan, the Runabout. Here is an extract of the description of the Runabout contained in the archive:

"A development of the 1909 prototype, the Runabout was one of the first ever vehicles created by the company founder, HFS Morgan. Unlike a modern car, the throttle is controlled by hand, and it is steered with a 'tiller' rather than a wheel! This steering

method meant it wasn't popular to begin with, until a conventional steering wheel was added the following year.

However, it was considered advanced for its day, with its light weight tubular steel chassis and 8 bhp V-twin JAP motorbike engine. It features two forward gears, but no reverse, so the driver would have to get out and push it backwards if required.

As none of the original 1910 vehicles survive, this particular car was built using the remains of the 1914 chassis and many genuine period components. The engine is original dating back to 1910, but still runs. In fact, the car is driven regularly, it has raced at Chateau Impney hill climb and at Montlhery near Paris, reaching nearly 50 mph."
