# The Future of NorceMog: Committee Membership

We are at that time of year where we seek nominations to join the NorceMog committee and shape the continuation of our successful centre through 2025/26. This year, we have a confirmed vacancy for Chair as the current chair, Andy Bleasdale, is resigning due to moving out of the area.

Committee membership is not too onerous; we currently meet once or twice a year with all other communication through phone calls, email, etc.

Below is a brief synopsis of the current roles at NorceMog, along with an invitation for members to nominate themselves if they are interested in contributing to the future of the Centre. While some incumbents may seek re-election, new offers of help and support are always welcome.

Apart from Centre Secretary, which is the preferred role of the MSCC as prime contact, the committee can be constructed however the Centre decides. All roles are voluntary and therefore it is more about how much individuals are prepared to commit to the role rather than "you must do this or that"! Our current structure consists of the following roles.

### Chair

The Chairperson leads the Centre in collaboration with the Centre Secretary, guiding day-to-day operations, chairing meetings, and leading presentations, such as annual awards at the Christmas meal. This role also involves supporting other committee members, acting as a spokesperson, welcoming new members, and ensuring member satisfaction.

Vacancy: This role is currently open!

## Centre Secretary (CS)

The Centre Secretary is the primary contact for the MSCC and coordinates the Centre's activities. In collaboration with other committee members, this role ensures compliance with MSCC requirements and delivers satisfactory services to NorceMog members. Whilst Andrew Threlkeld is content to continue he would be equally delighted to support a 'new' Centre Secretary if you desire this role.

### Treasurer

The Treasurer handles financial responsibilities, including collecting subscriptions, managing records of expenses, and maintaining a list of paid members. Additionally, the Treasurer prepares an Annual Report, which is independently reviewed and presented at the Annual General Meeting. All expenses require the approval of two committee members before payment. Linda Fearn is prepared to continue this role.

## Other Roles Currently Performed by Committee Members

## Regalia

This role involves maintaining and distributing any NorceMog merchandise, such as car badges, and reporting sales and stock to the Treasurer. Historically, this role also included purchasing NorceMog embroidered clothing and caps. However, NorceMog embroidered items are now available through the MSCC club shop.

## Competitions Secretary

The Competitions Secretary liaises with Motorsport UK (MSUK) regarding any permits required for Gymkhanas, scenic runs, and other events. Martin Cocks is the current incumbent.

### **Newsletter Editor**

The Newsletter Editor compiles, edits, and issues the monthly NorceMog News through the Centre Secretary. Roger Benton is prepared to continue in this role.

## Co-Opted Assistants (no limit to number)

These committee members are involved in the general operation of the Northern Centre. They attend committee meetings and contribute to the successful continuation of the Centre. Bryan Rawlinson, Peter Murphy, and Rosemary Murphy currently occupy three of these posts.

We look forward to receiving your nominations and working together to ensure a vibrant future for NorceMog.
